One scholarship in the amount of \$5,000 will be awarded in Capital One's Virginia/DC market.

Qualifications:

- Current high school seniors, must attend college in the upcoming academic year
- U.S. Citizen or legal resident
- Attending high school in Virginia or Washington, D.C.
- Hispanic

- Please complete this application and submit online only by Sunday April 30, 2017.
- Only submit the application and transcript. Any other supporting documentation will not be accepted.
- E-Mail current high school transcript to hispanicnetworks@gmail.com. (Note that any scholarship awards will be contingent upon verification of official high school transcripts.)

Finalists will be contacted for a personal interview by May 31, 2017. The final recipient will be determined after interviews are completed, and any awards will be subject to verification of transcripts and college registration.

For your convenience, we have provided the application questions below. You may choose to prepare your answers before selecting the "Next" button. The application will consist of requests for basic contact information, SAT/ACT/GPA scores and answers to the following essay-based questions:

1. What would you like to study in college/university? Do you know what type of career you want to pursue? (Describe your educational and career goals.)

2. How do you spend your time when you're not working on schoolwork or participating in school-related activities? (Describe your outside interests and extra-curricular activities.)
3. How would this scholarship impact your educational goals?
4. In approximately 300 words, describe how you have impacted the Hispanic community in an area of service, leadership or values.
